

PLAY & ART THERAPY PROGRAM

Theses uncertain times have been traumatic and depressing for everyone and especially more so for the children. JK team conducted an in-person effective Art therapy session as a creative coping tool. With excitement and utter thrill the children at the Home welcomed us with songs and dance performance & lovely handmade cards as a pleasant surprise. Covid related hygiene & awareness session with an interactive song made the children participate whole heartedly. Thereafter for the spontaneous art making session the children were divided into two age groups 6-11 and 12-18.



The children were engrossed in the art & craft they created beautiful wall hangings, cards, and unique designs on their mugs. They were given the freedom to express their creativity. They were thrilled with the outcome and we were stunned to see their skill. Then the evening came to a close with the CWC Mumbai team presenting our gift packages to each of the child. In August we conducted yet another session where we taught the children different methods of tie & dye along with other activities. With the permission of the CWC & Children Home Superintendent we have planned a month on month event in so doing we would connect with these children through art and craft sessions.

COVID-19 APPEAL

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a significant psychological impact on children especially girls in Residential Care Homes. We are working towards the development of the children on two levels: Educational and Therapeutic. These forms of psychotherapy aid in counselling children who have faced early childhood trauma. Jyoti Kalash having successfully run a Girls Home for over a decade will share their expertise in Trauma Recovery through Art Therapy projects.

We at Jyoti Kalash conducted an Art Therapy & Hygiene Awareness Day with the children/girls at a Children's Home, in collaboration with the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) in Mumbai.

JK generated a Covid Fund and with the resources bought gift packages for 40 children/girls. These packages included - masks, soaps, snacks and various art supplies like paints, sketchbook, colour pencils, pens and porcelain mugs



AFTER CARE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS 2021

December 2021 was very special and eventful for our girls. An event to celebrate 18 years of JK was conducted on 18th Dec. The Board of Directors, our friend and supporters & the extended JK family attended it. Time of sharing, fun and fellowship along with a presentation down memory lane highlighted the day.

An adventure outing was organised for the JK family to a water edge campsite in Kamshet, Lonavala. Time of bonding and re-union was much celebrated. Zip line, kayaking, swimming, shooting was much enjoyed and an evening of bonfire and sharing good times and praying together.



CAPACITY BUILDING AND TRAINING

In the past, we have collaborated with international organizations that provide training for the staff and caregivers of children at risk worldwide. We continue to partner with like-minded NGOs in the city of Mumbai as the most urgent need is for trained staff to care for children who have faced early childhood trauma and psychological abuse. Building the capacity of caregivers is essential to help them fulfil their key responsibilities and serve with diligence in their respective roles especially to those children who come from a traumatic background.

HYGIENE PROGRAM

Menstruation and menstrual practices still face many social, cultural, and religious restrictions which are a big barrier in the path of menstrual hygiene management. In today's time too, periods; a natural biological process, is still a matter of taboo. Little, inaccurate, or incomplete knowledge about menstruation is a great hindrance in the path of personal and menstrual hygiene management.

Jyoti Kalash organized multiple workshops on Menstrual Hygiene for women stakeholders of NGOS – in Red-Light Area (RLA) Grant Road, Mumbai. Educative and interactive awareness session, along with livelihood/economic empowerment opportunities. The program was attended by several women. Our aim is to stimulate and sensitize safe menstrual hygiene practices and we would continue to reach out to many such women groups in the community.
